The City of Yellowknife and the Yellowknives Dene First Nation (YKDFN) have solidified a government-to-government relationship and created a Joint Economic Development Strategy to align their economic interests. Strong branding and graphic design work supports this new relationship and presents a unified front, visually representing this historic partnership. PlanIt North was thrilled to have the opportunity to work with this committee and team to create an illustrative look and feel for the project.


- three tipis to represent the three communities: Yellowknife, Dettah, and Ndilo

ART OF HOSTING - FACILITATION TRAINING

At the end of May, PlanIt North joined staff of the Sahtu Renewable Resources Board in a three-day training course on the Art of Hosting, facilitation training. The course was delivered virtually by Harvest Moon Consultants out of British Columbia. The course included break-out sessions which encouraged us to look closer at facilitation approaches in our work and examined how to build more participatory and meaningful dialogue toward reaching consensus. Staff were able to take away a number of tips and techniques to add to their facilitation toolbox.

One useful theory we learned was about balancing our need for order and certainty (agendas, time schedules, etc...) with uncertainty and flexibility to allow for

unscheduled dialogue or processes. Sometimes the unscheduled occurrences lead to unplanned, beneficial outcomes. This sweet spot between chaos and order was labelled by our Harvest Moon teachers as the "chaord". It is from this "chaordic" space that creative and innovative ideas can emerge and be harvested through a more collaborative facilitation process.

HOUSING DEEP DIVE

PlanIt North staff hosted and participated in a 'Housing Deep Dive' learning and strategizing session on May 12 and 13th, 2022. This was an opportunity for staff to reflect and share insights on our experience with housing needs assessments and planning work to date. We also developed tools and best practices to inform future work in the housing sector. PlanIt North also invited external collaborators and reviewed case studies that were relevant to our northern context.

On the first day, the staff heard presentations from our external collaborators to learn about various programs and funds relevant to our work. We also discussed case studies to broaden our knowledge of northern housing issues. During the second day, we focused on the numerous Planit North NWT housing projects. Tom Parker and Brian Weadick presented their work on the Kakisa Housing Plan, and Darha Phillpot and Tom Parker discussed progress on the Hay River Housing Plan. Korry Garvey and Rabia Ahmed shared learnings from projects focused on strengthening the construction sector in Fort Good Hope. Learning from the two day session will strengthen PlanIt North's housing projects moving forward.
